The Concept of the Logo of ASEAN 2022

The lotus flower symbol represents a form of Khmer art derived from the relief carvings on the walls of ancient Khmer temples, which depicts purity and self-regeneration. The lotus flower symbol is beautifully encased in an intricate golden circle with the ASEAN emblem at the center to symbolize prosperity and harmony in peace. The meticulous placement of these symbols altogether embodies the spirit and joint efforts of the 10 ASEAN nations bound together by friendship and solidarity with the common overarching goal of overcoming all challenges towards the inclusive and sustainable development of the ASEAN Community now and in the future.



The blue color on 6 of the petals represents peace, stability, trust, confidence, solidarity, and cooperation which are the core aspiration of ASEAN.

The red color of 4 petals represents life, health, courage and dynamism of ASEAN.

The golden circle signifies grandeur, success, achievement and victory around the ASEAN Community building process, and sense of togetherness and unity of ASEAN.

The mixed colors epitomize the ethnic diversity of the 10 ASEAN Member States.
